



# Context I: Social supervision in Denmark

➤ The social supervision is handled by 5 selected municipalities - one in each region of Denmark.



➤ The 5 municipal councils are referred to as **The Social Supervisory Authorities**.

➤ **The Governmental Audit** of the 5 Social Supervisory Authorities is conducted by The National Board of Social Services (e.g. monitoring and professional support).



# ”Synspunkter från tillsynsobjekt” – my case

- This presentation will take a **macro perspective** on supervisory practices and user satisfaction in Denmark: How is the supervision carried out? How does the supervisory authority **approach and cooperate** with the social facilities?
- The law stipulates that supervisory practices must be **dialogue-oriented** and are to promote **learning** and **development of quality** in the social service facilities.
- We take a look at **regional and national surveys** on supervision of social services and how supervisory practices is perceived to balance between:
  - Instruction versus dialogue
  - Sanctions versus learning
  - Control versus development



# Perspectives investigated (I)

- In the national surveys (2015 and 2018) by the National Board of Social Services the satisfaction with the regional Social Supervisory Authorities is being examined by three main issues:
  - Satisfaction with overall cooperation
  - Satisfaction with the process prior to recent inspections
  - Satisfaction with the course of recent inspections
- The national survey is used by the National Board of Social Services to adjust its monitoring and professional support to the Social Supervision Authorities – and by the Ministry for Children and Social Services to adjust legislation.

# Examples of topics investigated (I)

- The competences of the inspectors?
- The balance between control and dialogue during the inspections?
- The acceptance of new topics and inputs by the inspectors?
- Changes due to the assessments and conclusions made by the inspectors?
- Contributions to the development of quality in the facility?



# Perspectives investigated (II)

- In the regional surveys (2015 and 2016) the regional social supervision authority focuses on the experience of the facilities regarding:
  - The specific inspections
  - Dialogue with the authority
  - The experience of being subject to increased supervision or obtaining an injunction
  - The use of the authority's website.
- The regional survey is being used by the authority for development of its supervisory practices and to optimize the cooperation with the social facilities in general.

# Examples of topics investigated (II)

## **Inspections:**

- The information given prior to inspections?
- The carrying out of the specific inspections?
- Follow up and reporting after inspections?



## **Injunctions and increased supervision:**

- The dialogue during meetings with the supervisory authority?
- If the supervisory authority listened to facts and points of opinion, acknowledged and took these serious?
- If the supervisory authority had formulated injunctions and required actions by the facility in an understandable way?
